

Bruce Cohen received his M.S. in History in August 2011. Bruce's advisor was Dr. Geoffrey Wawro and his thesis was "Campaigns Replete with Instruction": Garnet Wolseley's Civil War Observations and Their Effect on British Senior Staff College Training Prior to the Great War.
