Jordan Hayworth earned his Bachelor of Arts from High Point University in 2010. He majored in History and minored in Political Science. Having developed a passion for the French Revolutionary and Napoleonic Era while at High Point, he came to UNT to study that period under Dr. Michael V. Leggiere.

Jordan defended his dissertation, "Conquering the Natural Frontier: French Expansion to the Rhine River in the War of the First Coalition, 1792-1797," on 20 October 2015 and proceeded to graduate with the PhD on 15 December 2015. His dissertation won the 2016 Edward M. Coffman Prize/Society for Military History First Manuscript Award and was published in 2019 by Cambridge University Press under the title: **Revolutionary France's War of Conquest in the Rhineland, Conquering the Natural Frontier, 1792-1797**. He will also publish his MA thesis tentatively titled: "The Battle that Ended the Terror: The 1794 Fleurus Campaign and the French Revolutionary Wars." Dr. Hayworth also contributed a chapter, "The French Way of War" to **Napoleon and the Operational Art of War: Essays in Honor of Donald D. Horward**, edited by Michael V. Leggiere and published by Brill in 2016. His article: "Evolution or Revolution on the Battlefield? The Army of the Sambre and Meuse in 1794," appeared in **War in History** 21, no. 2 (2014).

Dr. Hayworth is Assistant Professor of Military and Security Studies, Air Command and Staff College, Air University, Maxwell AFB. Hayworth moved to Alabama in 2016 with his wife, Brittany. He is a devoted fan of the Atlanta Braves and enjoys listening to and performing country music.
