

Wilson C. Blythe Jr.

Lieutenant Colonel Wilson C. Blythe Jr., is a strategist with the U.S. Army. His service includes deployments to Operations Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom and Inherent Resolve. He was the lead author and editor of the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Russian New Generation Warfare Study and the Mosul Study Group Report. Additionally, Lt. Col. Blythe was one of the historians on the Chief of Staff of the Army's Operation Iraqi Freedom Study Group. He currently leads the Battlefield Development Plan branch at the U.S. Army Futures and Concepts Center, Fort Eustis, Virginia. His many accomplishments include: revitalized and leads the Army's Battlefield Development Plan initiative; Lead author and editor of TRADOC's Russian New Generation Warfare study and the Mosul Study Group report; being named one off nine officers from throughout the Army selected to serve on the Chief of Staff of the Army's writing team for the U.S. Army's official history of the war in Iraq; authored analytic products that were requested by the Secretary of Defense, National Security Advisor, and the Chief of Staff of the Army; developed and taught courses on U.S. Army doctrine, leadership, operational planning, and military history

Lt. Col. Blythe graduated from the University of Mississippi with a bachelor's degree in history. He holds a master's degree in history from Eastern Michigan University, where his thesis was on the development of the U.S. Army's AirLand Battle doctrine. Under Dr. Wawro's supervision, he completed his dissertation at the University of North Texas on the application of the operational art during III Corps Iraq surge campaign.

Lieutenant Colonel Blythe has published articles or presented papers on a number of topics related to U.S. and European military history and military theory. He is a recipient of the Army Historical Foundation's Distinguished Writing Award (2013) and was a finalist in 2018.
